John would like me to clarify that you guys don't necessarily need to allow these uses, and the joint meeting will simply help you figure out what you would like to do as a township.

Walter: I will continue to try to get the meeting scheduled before next month.

Kolon: Regardless of what we decide about event barns, I think we should continue to look at Ag tourism in general.

Walter: I think it is a good idea to separate the two. There was not much concern from our lawyer in the Ag tourism language other than event barns being in the commercial district. I think we can all agree that we are good to move forward with Ag tourism, but event barns we need to continue to discuss.

II. Second Homes/Tiny Houses

Walter: We have not dropped the conversation about second/tiny homes. We see the request for it and will continue to ponder it, though it is very difficult in these times. We need to discuss with the board how we'll proceed, if we decide to allow them. John Enos said if the Township Board and the Planning Commission decide to allow it, he'll craft language, though he has no language elsewhere in the state to base it off of. This simply means it will be a new endeavour.

H. COMMENTS FROM COMMISSIONERS

Thompson: I think meeting with the board is important. Something that has been lacking is enforcement about what we choose to regulate. It will take the board to decide to do that.
