F. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

I. Wedding/Event Barns

Walter: We all have copies of an AG tourism ordinance from another township. We need to decide if this is something we want to take further action on or leave as is. If we proceed with this, that means we will need to look at verbiage for wedding barns.

Thompson: I suggest we wait until our planning consultant is here.

Walter: Sounds good. Please look over the ordinance and come back with any suggestions. I want to ensure we give it enough discussion to decide if it is something we want to address.

G. NEW BUSINESS

Seefeld: At the last Township Board meeting we discussed short term rentals. I know that at our last Planning Commission meeting, we decided not to take further action. However, the

Township Board would like to see something done about it. They liked the idea of a 30 day minimum rental period.

Walter: We can certainly bring it back up again. I will let our planning consultant know so we are ready to discuss it at our next meeting. There is active legislation going through Lansing right now regarding short-term rentals. If it goes through, it will most likely limit our ability to regulate short-term rentals, if it doesn't supercede us altogether.

Kolon: Did the Township Board discuss enforcement? The 30 day minimum won't prevent anything if we don't enforce it.

Seefeld: They wish to see stronger regulations in our ordinances. During the AshKay Island trial, our current ordinance was brought up and apparently was not enough to sway the judges decision.

Thompson: We discussed the 30 day minimum, and even our planning consultant said it was unnecessary.

Walter: We'll add it back on the agenda for next meeting.
