# MANCHESTER TOWNSHIP WASHTENAW COUNTY, MICHIGAN ORDINANCE NO. 97

#### ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING MINERAL EXTRACTION MORATORIUM

At a meeting of the Township Board of Manchester Township, Washtenaw County, Michigan, ("Township") held at the Manchester Township Hall, on the 12th day of July 2022, at 7:00 p.m., Fusilier moved to adopt the following Ordinance, which motion was seconded by Seefeld.

An ordinance to enact a temporary moratorium for a period of one year on the permitting, consideration, approval, location, erection, construction, and/or installation of any Mineral Extractions.

WHEREAS, the Township has adopted a zoning ordinance and other ordinances, including Ordinance No. 39 ("Mining Ordinance") which regulate, among other things, Mineral Extractions. Mineral Extractions are generally the mining, quarrying, excavation, or other removal or processing of sand, gravel, soil, or other minerals from a mineral extraction site. For the purposes of this ordinance, Mineral Extractions encompass all like operations referenced in the Mining Ordinance and the Manchester Township Zoning Ordinance (including, but not limited to "Quarry," "the removal of soil, sand, gravel and other materials," and all activities which require an extractive or like permit under the Mining Ordinance); and

**WHEREAS**, due to concerns from the public and Township officials about appropriate regulations to regulate Mineral Extractions, among other issues associated with Mineral Extractions, the Township wishes to engage in a review of its existing Mining Ordinance and possibly revise regulations governing Mineral Extractions; and

**WHEREAS**, the Township has a legitimate purpose in addressing the proper design, size, location, and operation of Mineral Extractions in the Township; and

WHEREAS, the Township is reasonably concerned that continued application of the Mining Ordinance could cause future Mineral Extractions to be established in inappropriate or inadvisable locations within the Township; and

WHEREAS, it is appropriate to forestall such issues for the Township and to enact a temporary moratorium on such Mineral Extractions until any necessary revised regulations can be enacted; and

WHEREAS, the Township determines that the adoption of this ordinance, which is necessary to preserve the public peace, health, and safety by preventing the inappropriate location and establishment of Mineral Extractions in the Township during the time needed to study, review, and potentially revise the Township's current Mining Ordinance due to changed conditions within the Township.

NOW, THEREFORE, Manchester Township, Washtenaw County, Michigan, Ordains:

**Section 1. Title:** This Ordinance shall be known and cited as the Manchester Township Mineral Extraction Moratorium.

Section 2. Moratorium: The Township enacts a temporary moratorium on the permitting, consideration, approval, location, erection, construction, and/or installation of all Mineral Extractions in the Township for a period of one-year. Mineral Extractions are generally the mining, quarrying, excavation, or other removal or processing of sand, gravel, soil, or other minerals from a mineral extraction site. For the purposes of this ordinance, Mineral Extractions encompass all like operations referenced in the Mining Ordinance and the Manchester Township Zoning Ordinance (including, but not limited to "Quarry," "the removal of soil, sand, gravel and other materials," and all activities which require an extractive or like permit under the Mining Ordinance).

**Section 3. Severability:** The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable and if any part is declared invalid for any reason by a court of competent jurisdiction it shall not affect the remainder of the Ordinance which shall continue in full force and effect.

**Section 4. Repeal:** All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 5. Effective Date: This Ordinance shall take effect immediately after publication.

## Ordinance No. 97 Notice of Adoption
