ORDINANCE NO. 98**

**ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING COMMERCIAL WIND ENERGY CONVERSION  
SYSTEMS (WECS) MORATORIUM**

At a meeting of the Township Board of Manchester Township, Washtenaw County, Michigan, (“Township”) held at the Manchester Township Hall, on the 12th day of July 2022, at 7:00 p.m., Seefeld moved to adopt the following Ordinance, which motion was seconded by Thompson.

*An ordinance to enact a temporary moratorium for a period of one year on the permitting, consideration, approval, location, erection, construction, and/or installation of any Commercial WECS projects.*

**WHEREAS**, the Township has adopted a zoning ordinance and other ordinances, including Zoning Ordinance Amendments No. 67 and No. 84 (“WECS Ordinance”) which regulate, among other things, the Commercial WECS land use. A WECS generally is any device such as a wind charger, windmill, or wind turbine that converts wind energy to a form of usable energy. A Commercial WECS generally means any WECS designed and built to provide electricity to a utility grid (e.g., utility-scale wind farm); and

**WHEREAS**, due to concerns from the public and Township officials about appropriate regulations to regulate Commercial WECS land use, among other issues associated with the Commercial WECS land use, the Township wishes to engage in a review of its existing WECS Ordinance and possibly revise regulations governing the Commercial WECS land use; and

**WHEREAS**, the Township has a legitimate purpose in addressing the proper design, size, location, and operation of Commercial WECS in the Township; and

**WHEREAS**, the Township is reasonably concerned that continued application of the WECS Ordinance could cause future Commercial WECS to be established in inappropriate or inadvisable locations within the Township; and

**WHEREAS**, it is appropriate to forestall such issues for the Township and to enact a temporary moratorium on such Commercial WECS land uses until any necessary revised regulations can be enacted; and

**WHEREAS**, the Township determines that the adoption of this ordinance, which is necessary to preserve the public peace, health, and safety by preventing the inappropriate location and establishment of Commercial WECS in the Township during the time needed to study, review, and potentially revise the Township’s current WECS Ordinance due to changed conditions within the Township.

NOW, THEREFORE, Manchester Township, Washtenaw County, Michigan, Ordains:

**Section 1. Title:** This Ordinance shall be known and cited as the Manchester Township Commercial Wind Energy Conversion Systems (WECS) Moratorium.

**Section 2. Moratorium:** The Township enacts a temporary moratorium on the permitting, consideration, approval, location, erection, construction, and/or installation of all Commercial WECS in the Township for a period of one-year.

**Section 3. Severability:** The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable and if any part is declared invalid for any reason by a court of competent jurisdiction it shall not affect the remainder of the Ordinance which shall continue in full force and effect.

**Section 4. Repeal:** All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.


**Section 5. Effective Date:** This Ordinance shall take effect immediately after publication.

**Ordinance No. 98  
Notice of Adoption**

Please take notice that on July 12, 2022, the Township Board of Manchester Township adopted Ordinance No. 98, which imposes a one year moratorium on the permitting, consideration, approval, location, erection, construction, and/or installation of Commercial WECS (generally utility-scale wind energy project that are intended to provide electricity to off-site users using wind turbines, among other improvements) in the Township in order to allow appropriate time to study and potentially adopt revised regulations governing Commercial WECS.
